Reminder - Board of Directors Actions Required MIAA Form Acknowledging MIAA Rules 57 & 59

On August 17th, the MIAA Board of Directors adopted a new form that will be required for any students transferring to or reclassifying at an MIAA Member School. This required form is intended to serve as a supportive document for MIAA Member School leaders, the student-athletes and their families to

ensure they are educated on MIAA rules and the future impact they may have on one's eligibility. This form must be implemented in schools beginning on October 1, 2022. Form #9, titled "Acknowledgement of MIAA rules 57 and 59", is required for all incoming transfers and/or students reclassifying.
