Medical Personnel at Varsity Football Games -

"For all varsity football games, each team must employ a licensed physician, licensed athletic trainer, or certified EMT to be with their team (MIAA BOD voted to delay implementation until Fall 2022 season). A single medical provider shall be responsible for both teams for all subvarsity games unless the visiting team has its own medical coverage." (MIAA Handbook Rule 69.2, page 65)

Board of Directors Actions

Name, Image, and Likeness (NIL) - On

Wednesday August 18, The MIAA Board of Directors voted overwhelmingly to edit Rule 47 Amateurism and insert Name, Image and Likeness language (NIL). High School Athletic Associations throughout the country are proactively editing their amateurism policies so student athletes can retain their amateur status within the changing NIL landscape. This updated amateurism regulation provides clear language so our student-athletes do not violate their amateur status. <u>CLICK HERE</u> for more information.

NFHS Basketball Shot Clock Guidelines - In

accordance with NFHS Basketball Rule 2-14, each state association may adopt a procedure by which it implements a <u>35-second</u> shot clock effective with the 2022-23 season. This update to NFHS Basketball rules provides the first national high school standard for shot clock use. The MIAA Board of Directors voted 14-0 to support the Basketball Committee's recommendation to adopt the NFHS Shot Clock guidelines for the upcoming season. In adopting these guidelines, the Basketball Committee and the Board affirmed that shot clocks are not required to be mounted on backboard supports. <u>MIAA Handbook Rules</u> <u>66.2 and 66.10</u> have been updated to reflect this change to the new 35-second shot clock and 20 second reset. MIAA Rule Change Proposals for 2023-25

MIAA Rule Change Proposals for 2023-25 have been submitted and posted on the MIAA website. All MIAA Sport Committees and MIAA Administrative Committees will vote on these by November 1, 2022. The MIAA District Athletic Committees (DAC) and MSSADA votes are due by December 1, 2022. The MIAA Board of Directors will act upon the proposals by January 1, 2023. The Massachusetts Interscholastic Athletic Council (MIAC) will act upon all proposals by February 1, 2023 and their decision is final. CLICK HERE to view the proposals.

Growth and Improvement Plan

Re-structuring the Roles and Responsibilities of

Personnel MIAA - On Tuesday March 8, 2022, the Finance and Personnel Committee of MIAA voted unanimously to allow the Executive Director to move forward with his plan for Growth and Improvement. At the forefront of this initiative was to re-imagine the efficiencies of the tasks performed to effectively serve all of our member schools in a fiscally responsible manner.

Rule Clarification – Process and Information

At the August BOD meeting, the Board had a presentation from MIAA Directors Phil Napolitano and Richard Pearson addressing rule proposals and rule wording that does not rise to the level of a rule change. The Board supported the effort to allow MIAA staff to re-word and/or edit MIAA handbook rules for clarity and for better understanding by member school leaders. All Rule Clarifications will be accessed through the same **MIAA Handbook link** on the front page of the MIAA website. A good example of the editing process is Rule 39 where the title was changed for better clarity and less confusion.
