Guidance for purchasing equipment that will need to be recertified

- What is the recommended schedule for reconditioning and recertification? For example, football helmets, likely need to be collected immediately after the season so they can be reconditioned and recertified to the recommended interval of annually, and returned before the next equipment issue date.
- How can we budget for equipment reconditioning, recertification, replacement, and emergency repairs throughout the school year? For example, an athletic director may want to separate annual reconditioning costs from long-term replacement costs for helmets, shoulder pads, and other protective equipment.
- Can the reconditioner provide reports that help identify equipment nearing the end of its usable life? For example, a report may help the school plan for phased replacement instead of facing a large, unexpected purchase all at once.
- How should coaches be trained to identify equipment that should be removed from use and sent for inspection? For example, coaches should know how to flag equipment with cracks, missing hardware, improper modifications, counterfeit or incorrect labeling, loose padding, or signs of heavy wear.
- What turnaround times should we expect during peak reconditioning seasons? For example, schools may need to confirm deadlines before sending equipment out so they can avoid delays before camps, practices, or first games.
- How can we ensure equipment purchases align with future reconditioning and recertification requirements? **For example, before purchasing new equipment, the school should confirm whether the item can be serviced, recertified when applicable, and supported with replacement parts by the reconditioner of their choice.**
