

Massachusetts Women in Athletics Distinguished Service Award

Gertrude Fisher

*Varsity Volleyball Coach
John D. O'Bryant High School*



I have had the pleasure of knowing Gertrude Fisher for approximately 27 years as a fellow teacher (for 9 years) and as the Assistant Head of School and Athletic Coordinator (for 18 years) at the John D. O'Bryant School of Mathematics and Science (the "O'Bryant") in Boston. I am very familiar with Coach Fisher as an educator, as a coach and as a person and strongly recommend her for the MIAA's Distinguished Service Award.

For approximately 40 years, Coach Fisher served as varsity basketball coach at the O'Bryant (previously named Boston Technical High School). In the late 1980s, Coach Fisher became the only female coach of a major boys athletic team (basketball) in the state of Massachusetts. In 1987, Coach Fisher led the Boston Tech Boys Basketball team to within one point of winning the Division II state championship. She then went on to coach our Boston Tech/O'Bryant girls team for 30+ years compiling hundreds of wins, dozens of all-stars, several City Championships, and deep ventures in the MIAA State Tournament. For many years, Coach Fisher served on the MIAA Basketball Committee. Coach Fisher retired as varsity coach at the conclusion of the 2022-2023 season turning the program over to one of her former star players, Shalleyse Smallwood.

For over 30 years, Coach Fisher has served (and continues to do so) as O'Bryant's varsity volleyball coach. Similar to basketball, she has compiled hundreds of wins, dozens of all-stars, several City Championships, and deep ventures in the MIAA State Tournament. In 2014, she was chosen for the Massachusetts Volleyball Coaches Association's Hall of Fame. Coach Fisher's passion for the sport continues to this day.

Coach Fisher truly embodies O'Bryant "PRIDE," our school's core values of Perseverance, Respect, Integrity, Discipline, and Excellence. Above and beyond her expertise as a physical education/wellness teacher (she retired as a teacher approximately 10 years ago) and her ability to coach the "Xs and Os" of basketball and volleyball, Coach Fisher has served as a role model, mentor, confidant, and "big sister/aunt" for literally thousands of student-athletes in Boston. She seeks neither praise, nor the limelight but rather wants nothing more than to see our students excel in the classroom, on the athletic courts, and, most importantly, in life.

Coach Fisher's dedication to the students of the City of Boston and her commitment to cultivating opportunities for them to participate in interscholastic athletics is unparalleled.

I have known Mrs. Hines since 2008 and currently have the pleasure of working alongside her in my role as principal at Silver Lake Regional High School. In addition to serving as our district's World Language Coordinator, she has been a guiding force for female athletes, both as a coach and as our appointed faculty Game Manager, helping to shape a positive and supportive athletic environment for decades.



Throughout her tenure at Silver Lake Regional High School, she has established a relationship with her students and colleagues based on mutual respect. She is a kind and caring instructional leader who parents praise for her fairness and enthusiasm. She is approachable to students, parents, and staff alike. Most recently, she revamped our school's Saturday School, and works each weekend to support struggling students with closing academic gaps.

Beyond the classroom, Mrs. Hines has served as an incredible role model for our female student athletes, bringing not only skill and strategy to her players as a coach but also encouragement and mentorship. She consistently brings a level of professionalism and enthusiasm that uplifts everyone involved—players, coaches, parents, and spectators.

When she's not "working a game" you can bet we'll still find her in the stands or along the sidelines cheering for the students she teaches in her Spanish classes. Mrs. Hines never misses a game! Her support is unwavering and for more than twenty years, she has not only contributed to the athletic development of hundreds of female athletes but also instilled values of sportsmanship, perseverance, and self-respect that will remain with them throughout their lives.

Philosophy:

To give every athlete on the team the same great experience. Recognizing that everyone has different goals, will take different paths, and will find success in different ways. At the end of the season I want every athlete to feel that they have grown as a person and an athlete, have made valuable connections with teammates and coaches, and most importantly, that they know they have contributed to making our program better and stronger.

It is important to recognize that athletes commit themselves daily to you as the coach, to the team, and to themselves. They work hard at practice, follow the coach's guidance, they represent their school and community, and as a coach you are lucky to get to watch the transformation athletes make throughout their time on the team.

I have never strayed from the belief that I have the best job in the world.

One of Kathleen's students said, "Coach McCarthy is an incredible woman who has deeply impacted me, my teammates, and the entire Scituate community. Having such a positive and supportive coach for the last four years has been a true blessing. While she's coached us to victory in races, more importantly, she's taught us how to be good people. Her humble, generous, understanding, and patient nature sets an example for everyone. Coach McCarthy always makes time to connect with her athletes and support them after school. She brings so much love to the cross country and track teams. Many of us aspire to be as caring and empathetic as she is one day."

Another student shared, "For the past three years, Kathleen McCarthy has been my coach for both cross country and indoor track. I never imagined a coach could have such a profound influence on my life, but Coach McCarthy has proven me wrong in the best way possible. She not only welcomed me onto the team but also into her life with open arms. We've talked every day for nearly four years now, and I can't express how grateful I am for her and everything she's taught me. Of course, she's made me a stronger athlete with better endurance, but more importantly, she's taught me to believe in myself, to trust who I am, and to not let anyone hinder my goals. She is the person I admire most in life. The girls and I see her dedication, strength, and selflessness every day. Helping others is what she does best, and it doesn't go unnoticed. Everything she does, for her athletes, the SHS staff, and the Scituate community, comes from the kindness of her heart. Regardless of life's challenges, she always greets you with a smile because that's just who she is. She has created unbreakable bonds and friendships. We've all been asked since we were young, 'What do you want to be when you grow up?' My answer is: I want to be like Coach McCarthy, making a difference every day by radiating positivity and supporting everyone around her."

Throughout her coaching career at LMMHS in cross country, basketball, and track and field, Laura has far exceeded the traditional expectations of a coach. Jane Steinberg

*Volleyball Assignor and Official,
Former multi-sport coach, and

Ayer Public Schools*


Jane Steinberg is a legend in Ayer. A week doesn't go by where a student's parent or grandparent or community member doesn't mention her and her impact on them to me.

From 1971 to 2006, Jane poured her heart and soul into Ayer High School athletics, coaching multiple sports with distinction, most notably basketball and softball. In 1991, she rightfully took on the role of Athletic Director. Her basketball coaching record speaks for itself: 160 wins against only 62 losses, multiple league championships, and a coveted district title. The Lowell Sun recognized her expertise, naming her Basketball Coach of the Year three times and Softball Coach of the Year once. Yet, perhaps her most impactful victory came in the mid-1970s when she fearlessly led and won a crucial battle for equal pay for women in Ayer education.

Even after stepping down from coaching and the AD role, Jane's commitment to Central Massachusetts athletics remained unwavering. She continued to contribute as a respected volleyball official and assigner. Personally, she has been an invaluable mentor to me in my role as AD, patiently guiding me through the history and cherished traditions of our towns.

Her remarkable contributions have not gone unnoticed. In 2016, Jane was rightfully inducted into the Ayer Hall of Fame, a recognition followed by the induction of her remarkable 1981 basketball team in 2018.

Jane Steinberg was a true pioneer, blazing trails for women in sports and female athletic directors. She served as an incredible role model for countless young men and women and continues to be a guiding light for many athletic directors, coaches, and officials.

Jen Toland, Moderator

A sports reporter for the Worcester Telegram & Gazette (T&G) for 33 years, she is one of only two full-time female sports reporters in the T&G's history, succeeding the late Mary Shane.

Her coverage includes area college teams such as Holy Cross football and men's and women's basketball, as well as high school and local sports. She also covered the New England Patriots for 16 seasons, including six Super Bowls.

She is a graduate of Holy Name High School and Emerson College and is a recipient of a New England Newspaper Association (NENPA) award..



Kristen McDonnell

Girls Varsity Basketball Coach/School Counselor

A West Roxbury native, Kristen McDonnell has been coaching basketball in the high school ranks for the past 19 years. She recently completed her third season as the varsity girls' basketball coach at Norwood High School, following a three-year stint as the Norwood boys' varsity coach, where she led her team to the Division 2 state final.

Prior to these positions, McDonnell had been the girls' varsity coach at Braintree High School for 10 years. There, her teams won four Division 1 Mass State Championships, five Eastern Mass championships, and seven South Sectional titles. She was selected as Boston Herald's "Coach of the Decade" for her success on the court from 2010-2020.



Karlie Guimond

K-5 Special Education Teacher, Masters of Teaching Candidate

Karlie, a recent Smith College alumna from Hatfield, MA, is an elementary special education teacher and field hockey coach. A graduate of Smith Academy, where she played field hockey, basketball, and softball, she also served on the MIAA Student Advisory Committee (2018-19).

At Smith College, she played five years of field hockey, captaining the team in 2023-24, and studied elementary education and exercise sport studies. Additionally, she was involved in the Sport for Social Change Lab, the athletics DEI committee, and broadcasted Smith basketball and softball games.

This fall, she will teach K-3 special education, coach field hockey, and commentate on Smith Field Hockey home games. Passionate about accessibility and mental health support for girls and women in sport, she is thrilled to join this esteemed panel.

Having competed in sports during high school, she was fortunate to be awarded a scholarship to play field hockey at the University of Connecticut. During her time at UCONN, she competed in the NCAA tournament, won a Big East Championship, was named to the Big East All Tournament Team, as well as being named an NCAA First Team Regional All-American.

Jenn went on to start her own field hockey club team, "Chix With Stix", a developmental program for girls from kindergarten through high school. She currently is the Director of Athletics and Activities at West Bridgewater Middle Senior High School.



Ivy Watts

Mental Health and Resilience Keynote Speaker

Ivy holds a psychology degree from the University of New Haven and a Master of Public Health from Boston University. She is certified in Mental Health First Aid and QPR Training. In 2021, Ivy received the Massachusetts Interscholastic Athletic Association Wellness Partner of the Year Award.

As a former sprinter at Waltham High School and a track athlete at the University of New Haven, Ivy achieved All-American status in Track and Field. She was also recognized as a top 30 finalist for the NCAA Woman of the Year Award. Despite these accomplishments, Ivy privately struggled with her mental health, feeling unable to speak up due to the stigma she had internalized.

Ivy is the author of "You Are Worth Fighting For," a book focused on self-love and mental wellness.


