# 30<sup>™</sup> Annual MIAA Sportsmanship Summit Feedback Summary November 7, 2024

## Fostering a Positive and Respectful Athletic Environment: Key Feedback Themes

The feedback from students, parents, and coaches consistently highlights the importance of creating a positive, respectful, and controlled environment for school athletics. Several core themes emerged, emphasizing both what to avoid and what to promote.

# **Zero Tolerance for Negative & Offensive Behavior**

There is an **absolute and non-negotiable rejection** of all forms of negative and offensive behavior. This includes:

- Profanity, racial slurs, sexist/homophobic comments, taunting, and personal attacks directed at players, coaches, officials, or other fans.
- Physical aggression and unsafe behaviors, such as throwing objects.
- **Negative conduct** like yelling at officials, coaches, or players, trash-talking, and engaging in physical altercations. This applies to everyone involved in the athletic event.

## **Universal Respect & Professionalism**

A critical and pervasive theme is the demand for **respect towards everyone**. This means:

- No direct comments, yelling, arguing, or challenging of officials or coaches by parents, student fans, or student-athletes. Coaches are also expected to model this respect and handle disagreements privately and professionally.
- Respecting calls, avoiding negative comments, and showing empathy for all
  participants, including teammates, opponents, coaches, officials, and fellow
  spectators.
- Maintaining composure and acting professionally, especially when faced with challenging situations. This includes controlling emotions and representing the school positively.

### Coaches as Leaders & Role Models

Coaches are central to upholding these standards. They are expected to:

- Maintain control of their teams, stay within boundaries, and be the primary role models for sportsmanship.
- Manage their own emotions, language, and actions, and actively set and enforce behavioral standards for their team both on and off the field.
- All adults (parents and coaches) and older students (upperclassmen and captains) are expected to act as role models and demonstrate strong leadership through their actions, attitudes, and adherence to sportsmanship principles.

#### **Clear Boundaries and Non-Interference**

There's a strong emphasis on clearly defined roles and non-interference during games:

- Parents are explicitly told to "let the coach coach" and not interfere with the game or yell instructions to players.
- Parents and fans should not enter the field of play unless invited.

#### **Emphasis on Positive Support & Engagement**

Promoting a positive atmosphere is crucial:

- A strong emphasis on positive cheering, encouragement, and support for one's own team and athletes. This includes positive messages, uplifting feedback, and focusing on good plays rather than mistakes.
- Strategies to create an enjoyable game-day experience include themed games, pep rallies, halftime activities, music, and promoting school spirit. Encouraging student sections to organize positive cheers and supporting various sports events are also highlighted.
- Active support and presence are encouraged, with parents attending games and volunteering, students creating vibrant student sections, and fans actively engaging to create an energetic home atmosphere.

- Suggestions also revolve around fostering community and team cohesion through team dinners, bonding activities, and events that bring together players, parents, and the broader school community (e.g., Senior Nights, youth nights, alumni events).
- Organizing fundraisers and charitable initiatives not only supports athletic programs but also instills values of giving back (e.g., charity games, food drives).

# **Clear Communication & Accountability**

Effective communication and consistent accountability are vital:

- **Pre-season meetings** for parents, student-athletes, and student leaders are crucial to clearly communicate expectations (e.g., through PowerPoints, team contracts, athletic codes of conduct). Consistent reminders via PA announcements and posted signage are also key.
- The importance of **staff and administration being present at games** to monitor and address behavior is frequently mentioned.
- There's a call for accountability, including the removal of individuals exhibiting poor behavior and follow-through with discipline, possibly involving parents in the process.

## **School & MIAA Support**

Schools are seeking support from the MIAA, suggesting:

- The committee update and send out clear sportsmanship guidelines.
- Provide common expectation posters/banners.
- Potentially create videos for fans and parents on positive sportsmanship.
- Consistency in rules across schools is also desired.

# Student-Athlete Responsibility & Inclusivity

Student-athletes have specific responsibilities, and inclusivity is paramount:

- Student-athletes are expected to exhibit positive body language, avoid taunting or targeting opponents, refrain from arguing with officials, and uphold the reputation of their school.
- This also extends to **off-field behavior**, such as avoiding hazing, bullying, and chemical health violations.
- The feedback consistently stresses the importance of inclusivity, treating
  everyone equally regardless of skill level or role, and avoiding cliques or biases.
  This applies to coaches giving equal attention and students including all classmates
  in activities.

This comprehensive feedback underscores a collective desire for a positive, respectful, and well-managed athletic environment that prioritizes sportsmanship and community.
