2. MIAA Rule Reminders

- Cutoff and Deadlines
 - Cutoff Date: February 19, 2026
 - o **Bracket Release:** February 21, 2026

Tournament Scheduling & Committed Schedules

- o Ensure all team games are accurately listed on the committed schedule.
- Multi-team tournaments may be scheduled via the Arbiter tournament feature or by listing games as TBA.
- o Final schedule commitment deadline: December 19, 2025.

MIAA Ice Hockey Score Sheets

 Per MIAA Rule 72.4, all games must use the official MIAA Ice Hockey Score Sheet. Score sheets were mailed to all school ADs in November.

Players on the Bench

- Please adhere to **Rule 72.3**, which will be strictly enforced during the tournament:
 - A maximum of 22 players may be dressed and on the bench during both the regular season and tournament.
 - During the tournament, two of the 22 must be dressed goaltenders.

• Running Clock Clarification - Under MIAA Rule 72.1.2:

- Running time begins with a 10-goal differential in the 2nd period or 6-goal differential in the 3rd.
- Once initiated, running time continues for the remainder of the game, regardless of goal differential changes.

 Penalty time also continues to run during all stoppages, as the rule does not provide for stopping the penalty clock.

3. MIAA Tournament Sites

- **4. NFHS Rule Changes -** Click the link provided for a visual summary of rule updates.
 - Rule 9-8-4: "A puck on the outside of the goal netting below the crossbar shall be considered in play by both teams. A puck resting on top of the goal netting between the crossbar and goal frame shall be considered unplayable, resulting in an immediate stoppage."
 - Rule 3-8: Electronic Devices "Electronic devices shall not be used by team
 personnel or spectators to communicate with on-ice players or goalkeepers
 during play. No player or goalkeeper shall wear any audio (microphone) or video
 (camera) device during the game."
 - o Penalty:
 - First offense: *Misconduct*
 - Returning with illegal equipment: Game misconduct
 - Neck Laceration Protectors (NFHS Rule 3-4-4):
 - "All players shall properly wear a neck laceration protector that shall not be modified from its original manufactured state and shall be worn as intended by the manufacturer. If a player's neck laceration protector is not being worn, or comes off while play is in progress, an official shall order the player to return to the player's bench and play may continue. If the player does not comply, play shall be stopped, and that player shall be penalized."
 - o **Penalty for noncompliance:** *Minor penalty*

5. Mulloy Sportsmanship Award
